





## **Updating Applications**

### **UNIVERSITY OF ALBERTA**

After submitting your application to the University of Alberta, you can update your high school grades through the 'Course & Grade Update Form' available on your UAlberta Launchpad between February 12 and April 30.

Updates are not accepted after April 30.

Acceptable updates include adding or updating final marks for completed Grade 12 courses, adding or updating mid-term marks for full-year courses, and dropping courses if withdrawn.



To apply: Fill out the application form and attach an essay of up to 500 words telling your story of community involvement.


Successful applicants must:

## myPass vs. PASS



myPass is a Government of Alberta program. It is used to access diploma results, to access transcripts, and for post-secondary applications.

To sign up for myPass, the first step is to complete the myPass Google Form on your child's grade-level Google Classroom. From there, the graduation coaches will add their personal email address to myPass. You will then be able to log in using the email address provided.

PASS is ECSD's part-time alternative selfpaced school. You can register for modulebased programming to upgrade or retake courses, or to get ahead on graduation requirements.



## Ticket Sales on PowerSchool

Commencement Tickets: Initial sale from May 1st - May 22nd

Wrist band commencement tickets will be issued to students when they are given their grad cap and gown packages on Thursday June 5<sup>th</sup> at the commencement rehearsal in the gym. All tickets must be purchased before this date, as we will be unable to offer ticket sales at the door this year. Each grad will have their entry included in the grad fee so they will not need to purchase a ticket. Commencement ticket sales will be capped at 3 per grad, not including their own (so four tickets altogether). After May 22<sup>nd</sup>, the remaining commencement tickets will be opened up for general purchase to a maximum capacity of 1850. Ensure that your first 3 commencement tickets are purchased by May 22<sup>nd</sup> or you may end up not being able to purchase tickets afterwards.

**Banquet Tickets:** On sale from May 1<sup>st</sup> – May 15<sup>th</sup>

Wrist band banquet tickets will be distributed on June 5<sup>th</sup> as well. Seating will be pre-assigned and there will be a table map and name listing at the entrance to the hall. Seating will be checked by ECC staff and security and anyone without an assigned seat will be asked to leave the venue immediately. Tables can be selected when purchasing your tickets, though table placement may be subject to change.

-Students **must have <u>paid their Grad Fee</u> a**nd we request that they have <u>no outstanding school fees</u>
